RULES and CONSTITUTION

1. TITLE

The Association shall be called the 'Midland Counties Bowls Association', hereafter called the 'Association'.

2. OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the Association shall be: -

- a) to promote, safeguard and foster the level of green game amongst the County Associations in Membership.
- b) to hold Annually a Midland Counties League Championship and a Midland Counties Champion of Championships.
- c) to hold Annually any other Inter-County Competitions as the Council of the Association shall be determined.
- d) to hold Annually Inter-County Matches, Inter-Association Matches and President's Matches as the Council of the Association shall be determined.
- e) to hold Annually President's Matches with Clubs affiliated to the Member County Associations, where such Clubs, are celebrating Special events.

3. MEMBERSHIP

Membership of the Association shall be open to the County Associations of Derbyshire, Leicestershire, Lincolnshire, Northamptonshire, Nottinghamshire, Warwickshire, and Worcestershire

4. SUBSCRIPTIONS

An Annual Subscription payable by the County Associations in Membership shall be due before the 31st March, each year or such other sum as may be agreed by the Executive Committee.

5. ADMINISTRATION

The affairs of the association shall be administered by a Council consisting of the President, Vice-President, Immediate Past President, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Competition Secretary, Honorary Assistant Secretary, all Past presidents together with three representatives appointed by each County association in Membership, all of whom shall be entitled to vote. Twelve members of the Council shall form a Quorum.

6. ELECTION of OFFICERS

At the Annual General Meeting, each year the following Officers shall be elected:

a) President, Vice-President, who shall be elected to serve two years
 Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Competition
 Secretary, Honorary Assistant Secretary who shall be elected to serve for one year

(4) All games shall be of 21 ends.

In each game, a win for an individual four shall count as two points, a tie one point and a loss nothing. For the County, a win shall count ten points, a tie five points and a loss nothing.

When all the matches have been played, the winner shall be the County with the most points.

In the event of two or more Counties having the same number of points scored then, the shots difference will decide the winner. In the event of two or more Counties having the same shots difference, then the County with the greatest number of winning rinks over the six matches shall be declared the winner.

- (5) It shall be the responsibility of any County failing to fulfil a match, without enough notice (two weeks) to bear any costs involved in the cancellation.
- (6) The starting time for ALL GAMES shall be 2.00 pm, including trial ends, except by mutual agreement of the Counties concerned. If within a period of thirty (30) minutes from the fixed time for the commencement of the game, a side fails to appear then, the side will be disqualified unless, in the opinion of the Umpire there is a reasonable explanation for the non-appearance of the side in which case, the matter shall be referred to the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall rule whether the game be re-arranged or awarded to the aggrieved County.
- (7) After the game, the Representative of each competing County must agree on the result and communicate (by telephone, text or e-mail) the result to the Midland Counties Competition Secretary, within 48 hours of the finish of the match.
- (8) The winning County shall hold the 'Francis Burton Trophy' and the runners-up 'Warwickshire Cup'. The Association shall provide thirty (30) medals to the winning County, for distribution to their players.

(9) INCLEMENT WEATHER

The winning County shall hold the 'Francis Burton Trophy' and the runners-up 'Warwickshire Cup'. The Association shall provide thirty (30) medals to the winning County, for distribution to their players.

(10)DRESS - PLAYING

Brown or white shoes, white or county trousers/shorts, white socks, county or white shirts.

INTER COUNTY CHAMPIONSHIP

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- The Competition shall be open to all Counties affiliated to the Midland Counties Bowls Association and played under the W.B.B Laws of the Game and in accordance with the byelaws currently laid down by Bowls England and/or the Midland Counties Bowls Association.
- Each County shall be represented by six rinks of four players, all of whom shall be members of clubs affiliated to their County. Matches are six rinks, failure to fulfil the six rinks will result in the offended County receiving 22 points. All financial commitments shall be the responsibility of the offending County.

IN DEFAULT:

- (1) The minimum number of players per team per rink shall be 3 (Three).
- (2) If any Team has a player short on a rink then that team shall play with six bowls against eight. The order of play is, Lead, Lead, Two. Lead, Lead, Two, Three, Skip. The total number of shots scored by each team at the completion of the game will count.
 - No player shall play for more than one County in any one year.
 - All games are to be played on full-size greens with banks and ditches.
- (3) The Counties be split into two areas geographically, Lincolnshire to be in Group 1 and Worcestershire in Group 2. One of the remaining 5 Counties to be drawn to represent Group 1 for the first two years and Group 2 for the second two years.
 - Group 1 (First two year period) to have 4 Counties each County shall play each other County once per season, on a home and away basis, fixtures reversed for second year of play.
 - Group 2 (First two year period) to have 3 Counties each County shall play each other County once per season, on a home and away basis, fixtures reversed for second year of play.
 - For the second two year period Group 1 will have 3 Counties and Group 2 will have 4 Counties.
 - Following this a new draw will take place for the "floating" County and it shall not be the same County as drawn in the previous four year cycle.

The winners of each Group to meet and play at a Neutral venue to decide the Champion.

- b) A candidate for the office of Vice-President must be nominated by the County Association of which he is a Member and his nomination submitted in writing to reach the Honorary Secretary of the Association, not later than 31st December.
- c) Each County Association in Membership shall, in turn, be entitled to nominate one of its members as a candidate for the office of Vice-President and commencing in 1974, the sequence of nominations shall be as follows:- Nottinghamshire, Derbyshire, Leicestershire, Northamptonshire, Warwickshire, Worcestershire, Lincolnshire.
- d) An Honorary Auditor, who shall not be an Officer of the Association, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Competition Secretary and Honorary Assistant Secretary, shall be the only Officers eligible for re-election.
- e) The President-Elect and the Vice-President will take office at the end of the Annual Luncheon formalities when the Chain of Office will be handed over. The Annual Meeting will be chaired by the President of the year.
- f) If an Officer has to retire for whatever reason, the Executive Committee have the power to co-opt a Member to fill the vacancy until the next Annual General Meeting.

7. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

At the Annual General Meeting, the Association shall appoint an Executive Committee consisting of the President, Vice-President, Immediate Past President, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Competition Secretary, Honorary Assistant Secretary, and with Honorary Assistant Secretary one Member from each County Association in Membership nominated as their elected representative. Each Affiliated County will have only ONE Vote.

- a) The Members of the Executive Committee of the Association will be responsible for conducting all the affairs and upholding the Rules and Constitution and the objectives of the Association.
- b) The functions of the Executive Committee shall be:
 - i) To meet not less than twice per annum.
 - ii) To receive at each Meeting reports from Officers of the Association and to consider and deal with all administrative matters.
 - iii) To make recommendations or nominations as it thinks fit to the Annual General Meeting or Special General Meeting of the Association.
 - iv) To safeguard the stability of the Associations Finances.
 - v) To co-opt any person who may assist in these functions
 - vi) Six members shall form a Quorum of the Executive Committee.

8. HONORARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP

Officers and Executive Members may be honoured with Life Membership on the recommendation of the Executive Committee and will be entitled to wear an Honorary Life Members Flash on their Midland Counties Blazer.

9. ANNUAL MEETING

- a) The Annual Meeting of the Council shall be held in March each year. Any Member of an Affiliated County Association may attend but shall not have voting powers.
- b) Not less than 21 days notice of the meeting shall be given to each County Association and to each Past President, together with a Notice of Matters to be transacted at the Meeting.
- c) Notices of Motion(s) shall be given in writing to the Honorary Secretary, 28 days before the date fixed for the Meeting.
- d) Amendments to Notices of Motion(s) shall be given in writing to the Honorary Secretary 14 days before the Annual General Meeting. Such Notices of Amendments are to be sent to Member County Associations and Past -Presidents,7 days before the Meeting.

10. SPECIAL MEETINGS

A Special Meeting of the Council shall be called: -

- a) In pursuance of a resolution passed by the Executive Committee.
- b) Or at 21 days of receipt by the Honorary Secretary of the Association, of a requisition in writing, signed by the Honorary Secretary of the Member Association, stating fully the reason for the Meeting. No less than 7 days' notice of the Meeting shall be given to each Member County Association and each Past- President and the Notice shall state the purpose for which the Meeting has been summoned.

11. LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP

An Annual League Championship shall be held in which Member County Associations shall play each other with a side of 6 teams of Fours on a home and away basis in alternate years and —

- a) All matches shall be played by the Laws of the Game.
- b) Points to be awarded in each Match as follows -10 points to the side winning the Match (in the event of a tie, 5 points to be awarded to both).2 points to be awarded to each winning rink (in the event of a tie on any rink, 1 point will be awarded to each side).
- c) The Competitions Secretary shall prepare a League Table and shall notify County Secretaries of the result(s), as soon as possible, after the completion of all Matches in the Championship.
- d) The Champions shall hold the Francis Burton Trophy for one year and the Runners-up shall hold the Warwickshire Cup for one year.

12. CHAMPIONS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Annual Championships shall be held for which the Competitions shall consist of the Singles, Pairs, Triples, Fours and Under 25's Singles Champions of each of the Member County Associations for that year. All Matches shall be played by the current Laws of the game. (Refer to Rules for the Champion of Championships).

The Draw for order of play shall be made by the Executive Committee Meeting held in the last quarter of the year preceding the Championships. The President and Officers shall have the privilege of deciding the venue. All Trophies shall be held for one year.

13. HONORARY SECRETARY

The Honorary Secretary shall keep a record of all the business transacted at the Council and Committee Meetings and carry out all the secretarial duties by decisions of the Council and its Committees.

14. HONORARY ASSISTANT SECRETARY

The Honorary Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary with the arrangement for friendly matches and any other duty specified either by the Hon Secretary or the Council.

15. HONORARY TREASURER

The Honorary Treasurer shall act by the decisions of the Council and its Committees and shall keep and render to the Annual General Meeting of the Council, a precise account of the Income and Expenditure for the past year, duly Audited by the Honorary Auditor. Copies of the Audited Statement of Accounts shall be sent to each Member of the Council, together with the Notice convening the Meeting.

16. ALTERATION of RULES

These Rules shall not be altered or rescinded except with the consent of the least two-thirds of the members present and voting at the Annual General Meeting of the Association or a Special Meeting convened under Rule 10 and the Notice of the Meeting shall set forth the terms of the proposed alterations.
